

In my spare time I love spending time with my family, either relaxing at home or going to explore with them the beautiful nature of Hong Kong.






Digital Art - Forging the Future with Disruptive Technology and Ideas

Mission for **Migrant Workers**

The MFMW, remains committed to "Serving Migrants Anytime, Anywhere". Empowering migrant domestic workers (MDWs) while ensuring they know they are an integral part to our Hong Kong community, has driven us for the past 42 years and counting. Whether responding to one who lost her job late at night, providing care pack to a COVID-19 positive MDW or facilitating work and life skills trainings, we have to the latest needs.

With the donation from the Swiss Association and Swiss Chamber of Commerce, we were able to adapt and continue our services into this new normal, reaching over 50

MDWs a month through direct services. These include sheltering migrants as we assisted in pursuing cases in the Labor, police or medical and answering questions through our hotline and weekly social media live streams.

With your support we held more sessions of Employment Contract Orientation to newly arrived MDWs and expanded our life skills programs to include mental health issues such continued to adapt to provide as Mental Health 101, Stress management, and Coping with Grief, as we all face the impacts of the pandemic. 30 to 50 MDWs were reached on Sundays (face-to-face) or weekday evenings online after-working hours, in language for MDWs.

Born with pencils in his mouth, Daniel has been drawing funny pictures of anything that came to his mind from a tender age.

His parents ran a hairdressing saloon, so he had to help out from a very young age. Often time, lots of colourful dyes were "available" in the shop, and so he started his first few masterpieces colouring the walls and storeroom of the shop. After several fruitless at-

tempts to hide all the colourful mixtures and dyes, his parents finally bought him a large box of crayons and pencils – and that is how Daniel started his passion of drawing and painting! Now, a very few years later, he remains to be very passionate about his compositions and, apart from just simple illustrations, he also amuses his friends and colleagues with caricature drawings.

He always leaves his house with a sketch book and pencil in his briefcase. Once he sees something interesting, he will make a few drafts. At home, he will sit down and try to bring his ideas to life. Sometimes it does not work right away, and more than one sketch is needed before the whole impression will be ready for the next step, the final layout. He also gets his inspiration during his trainings but without having a sketchbook in his hand! Daniel uses different pencils and tools to work on new ideas and techniques. The most time-consuming stage of the drawing lies in colouring where details and themes emerge.

For over 25 years, he has been contributing special portrayals of a Swiss Alphorn in a humorous way to the Swiss Association and Swiss community at large. Apart from the Swiss Alphorn, his "iconic mice" are always featured alongside the beautiful artwork.

Daniel is also teaching young children the art of drawing and is always amazed on what creations the little people can put on paper. Much is written on how drawings can improve children's intelligence. Daniel agrees that to a certain extent that children can benefit from being artistic in their early lives. But he also believes that instead of placing children

to any form of tests to indicate their intelligence, they should be given the freedom of drawing anything they like. Every child has a different way of learning, therefore, he strongly suggests to purchase crayons and pencils for children at a very early stage in their lives so the walls and storerooms in their homes are not being coloured by dyes or any other forms of colorizations.

In the Spotlight: Hans Lutz

After more than five decades in Hong Kong, Mr. Hans Lutz is saying goodbye to his friends in Hong Kong and moving back to Switzerland. Below, the reverend tell us a little about himself and answer a few questions from s'Alphorn.

I was born 1936 in Bern where I grew up. I studied theology and was ordained a pastor. The example of the French workers priests led me to work in a factory for one year. Later I was accepted by the Basel Mission and was sent to Hong Kong in 1968. I was assigned to join the Hong Kong Christian Industrial Committee (CIC). The CIC was part of an Asia-wide effort of the churches to respond to the industrialisation in Asian countries. For 24 years I was on the staff of the Committee which led to the formation of the Association for the Rights of Industrial Accident Victims and the now dissolved Confederation of Trade Unions. At the same time I was a minister of the Tsung Tsin Mission, a local church which grew out of the work of the Basel Mission over the past 175 years.

From 1992-97 I was the coordinator for the work of the Basel Mission in Asia, and from 1997-2002 I was Executive Secretary for Justice and Social Concern of the Hong Kong Christian Council.

In 1975 I was married to Shirley Shen Siu Ling. She passed away in 2019.

Why, in the late 60's, Hong Kong seemed an interesting place to live and work?

When I arrived, Hong Kong was an industrial



city with almost one million men and women working in factories or in the construction industry. The garment industry was by far the largest one, followed by spinning, weaving and dying. Other industries were electronics, plastics and metal. The riots in 1967 had alerted government and community to the need for improvement in working conditions. In the following years many pieces of legislation were passed. The CIC could contribute to the changes.

With Singapore, Hong Kong was the only political entity in the world composed of a single city. The local and the "national" were identical. It was possible to have direct access to almost all levels of government. This made it possible of a small organization like the CIC to have an impact.

Looking back at your work in Hong Kong, what brings you more satisfaction?

I could participate in the development of civil society. Besides the CIC I was active in community organization and the formation of the Hong Kong section of Amnesty International.

What was the most challenging time you faced in Hong Kong?

A very big challenge for which I was ill prepared



occurred in the early 70s. At that time the blind workers in the workshop of a charity went on strike against the management. They organized a sit-in at the star ferry. I became the coordinator of all the support groups. The first stage of the negotiations with the board ended in failure. I blamed my-self for it. Fortunately the blind workers continued their agitation until the workshop was taken over by a new management.

The recent changes in Hong Kong present a major challenge, although being in retirement I am more of a spectator. But it saddens me that Hong Kong society has changed to such an extent.

What is your favourite place in Hong Kong?

The Lantau Mountain Camp on Sunset Peak. Before air travel became cheap I used to spend the summer holidays on the mountain.

One of my favourite hiking trips is the walk from Tai Shui Hong near Ma On Shan over the hill to Saikung by way of Mui Tze Lam.

What are the Swiss habits you could not lose?

Singing Swiss songs even if only to myself. Eating potatoes and cheese from time to time.

What are your plans for Switzerland?



When I was young, my godfather gave me some money for a trip to Israel. Up to know I have not made use of it. So I plan to go there to visit the places mentioned in the bible, to see modern Israel and to spend some time with Palestinian organizations

Otherwise I look forward to receive guests from Hong Kong, to meet friends and to read books.


